Robert “Roy” Lee Taylor, Jr. was born on May 2, 1957 to the late Robert, Sr. & Julia Crump Taylor of Quinton, Virginia.

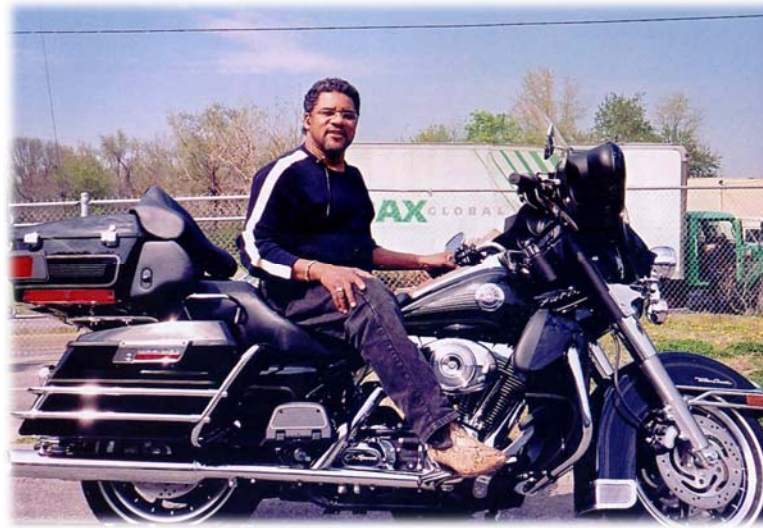
